Brief description of the partner:	<p>Brandenburg University of Applied Sciences is one of 12 higher education institutions in the state of Brandenburg with 2.700 full-time students at the Department of Business and Management, the Department of Informatics and Media and the Department of Engineering.</p> <p>With the founding of the university, just an hour's drive from Berlin, in April 1992, the city of Brandenburg on the river Havel became a university town for the first time in its history of over a thousand years. The main building of the former military barracks houses today the university administration as well as the Department of Business and Management. Where the cavalry once practiced military drills, students now cram for exams. An excellent library has been set up in the former stables, and what was once the officers' mess has been rebuilt into buildings housing modern lecture halls.</p> <p>This young university is a practically-based higher education institution that has an international flavour, and emphasises applied learning aimed at equipping students with the knowledge and skills required to follow professional careers. The excellent environment in this small but expanding university offers exceptional opportunities; close personal contact with professors, spacious laboratories, workshops and computer facilities and small study groups.</p> <p>The university promotes with particular emphasis international exchange in teaching, research and study. Brandenburg University has more than 50 partnerships with universities across Europe as well as overseas. More than 10% of the students come from abroad.</p> <p>The University cooperates closely with public and private sector companies and institutions in the region which are involved in research and development projects.
